It is incredibly equipped to ensure a successful start for all aspiring graduates. OUR HEAVENLY PATRONESS

St. ALPHONSA was born in Kudamalur, in the diocese of Changanassery, India, on 19th August 1910, to Joseph and Mary of the ancient and noble family of Muttathupadathu. Annakutty read the biography of St.Threse of Lisieux which instilled in her a strong desire to become a saint. Annakutty joined the Clarist Convent at Bharananganam. Her vestition was held on 19th May 1930.

From her birth, the life of the saint was marked by the cross, which was progressively revealed to her as the royal way to conform herself to Christ. With an attitude of a victim for the love of the Lord, happy until the final moment and with a smile of innocence always on her lips, St. Alphonsa quietly and joyfully brought her earthly journey to a close in the convent of the Franciscan Clarists at Bharananganam at 12.30 on the 28th July 1946, leaving behind the memory of a Sister full of love and saintliness. She is buried at Bharananganam. Her tomb at Bharananganam turned into a great centre of pilgrimage attracting people from far and near.

In 1984 the Pope officially declared that Sr. Alphonsa had heroically practised Christian virtues. A miracle wrought through her intercession was also formally approved by the Holy See on 16th July 1985. She was beatified by Pope John Paul II on 8th February 1986 at Kottayam and decided as a saint by the pope Benedict XVI on March 1 2008. It was officially declared on October 12, 2008.

St. Alphonsa is the first Indian woman to be elevated to sainthood. All Indians are proud to have St. Alphonsa, the first Catholic saint in India, born of Indian parents, lived and sanctified her life in India. So, the college is proud to hold St.

Alphonsa as the patron, for her great ideals of determination, sacrifice and commitment to the society. It preserves the memory of St. Alphonsa whose saintly life of love and service has always been an inspiration.

STUDENT SUPPORT PROGRAMMES

ARISE (AlphonsiansRising to Impulse Social Empowerment)

ARISE is an autonomous social welfare organisation of the students under ACT. This organisation was instituted by Rev. Fr. Scaria Mangarayil, the manager of ACT in the year 2018. It conducts various socially useful activities in and around the campus.

PTA

Membership of the PTA is compulsory to the parents of all students of the college. The PTA executive regularly meets to discuss and formulate policies to uplift the standard of the college.

Tally Course

The college provides tally course for the students of Commerce and Business Administration to equip each and everyone who comes out of this college to meet the demands of the commercial society.

Tutorial System

This system has been specifically intended to bring up the abilities of the student through proper motivation and guidance. It is also meant to understand the student, his/her family conditions, social and cultural status, the problems that he/she faces in and outside the class etc. and help him/her to tide over those problems. For this, a teacher is given charge of a class and he acts as the class tutor. The class tutor keeps the details of the students from entry level to exit level. He guides, helps and motivates the student and keeps liaison with the parents. The system also ensures effective teaching and sufficient attention on the student and fosters the general discipline of the college. The student is expected to consult the tutor on all academic non academic matters. All applications and requests to the principal shall be submitted only through the tutor countersigned by HoD.

Students Guidance and Counselling Centre

The Guidance and Counselling Centre aims at assisting students to maximize their overall growth and to overcome their academic and personal problems. Service of qualified persons is available in assisting students to identify and recognize their interests, abilities and skills to match their chosen careers. Students who need the appointment of experts shall register their names with the coordinators.

Student Support/Remedial Programme

The programme is designed to give special attention to students who need extra help and guidance to keep abreast with other classmates. Special evening classes are handled by teachers on a structured basis.

Entrepreneurial Development Club (ED Club)

The ED club aims to inculcate values like integrity, discipline, honesty etc, sensitise students on the economic and industrial development scenario, inculcate entrepreneurial culture, bring in successful entrepreneurs and students together and create academic and industrial research linkage.

Women's Welfare Cell

The cell is constituted as per the directive of the UGC to redress the grievances, if any, of the lady students and the women-members of the staff of the College. Cell also aims at motivating the girl students to strive the gender equality in diverse fields with a motto of grooming them to lead a dignified life in the society.

DISCIPLINARY RULES

Students are hereby instructed to strictly follow the disciplinary rules of the College. Ignorance of rules is no excuse. Students are expected to read the notice board on a day to day basis. It is the duty of every student to abide by the rules and regulations of the college and conduct himself/herself

with decency and decorum. Violation of the rules will result in disciplinary action against the offenders and imposition of punishment including dismissal.

A. IDENTITY CARDS COMPULSORY

All students admitted to the college shall compulsorily wear their Identity Cards whenever they are present on the college campus. Duplicate ID cards can be had from the office on genuine grounds. The Identity Card shall be surrendered to the office at the time of claiming their fund of caution deposit or issuing of Transfer Certificate/Qualifying Certificate, whichever is earlier.

B. MOBILE PHONES BANNED

The use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the college campus as per Government order. Offenders will be levied with fine and the mobile phone will be confiscated.

C. MANDATORY DRESS CODE

Students should wear the prescribed uniform on all working days. Decency should be maintained in the way the dress is stitched and put it on.

D. CHARACTER AND CONDUCT

- Conduct Certificate will not be issued as a matter of course. It has to be earned by the student's good conduct and behaviour. The decision of the Principal shall be final regarding this matter.
- 2. Students shall greet both teaching and non teaching staff on the occasion of their first meeting them during the day.
- 3. When the Principal or teacher enters a classroom,

- students shall stand to greet and keep standing till they are asked to sit down.
- 4. Every morning we begin our work with a prayer. When the bell goes at 9.20 a.m., all the members of the staff and students are expected to keep standing in silence till the prayer ends.
- 5. Students should be seated in their respective class rooms before the teaching hour commences.
- 6. Students should be seated in their respective class rooms by 9.20 a.m. and should not leave the classes except during intervals.
- 7. When a student wants to enter or leave the classroom while the class is on, he /she shall do so only after getting the permission of the teacher.
- 8. During the absence of the teacher and while moving from one class to another, students are expected to keep silence.
- Students shall not loiter on the verandas or college premises during working hours for any reasons whatsoever.
- 10. Students are advised to use the library during free periods.
- 11. Students shall not enter any class other than their own.
- 12. No indecent representation shall be made by any student towards any other student either in words, letters, gestures or by any other means.

E. ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

1. Students should be regular and punctual in attending

classes.

- 2. Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each hour by the teacher engaging the class.
- 3. If one teaching hour is missed it is equal to missing half a day's attendance.
- 4. Students who do not have at least 75% of attendance are not eligible to appear for university/End semester examinations. In such situations he/ she has to repeat the semester after the course period along with the junior batch.
- A student abstaining from classes without proper acknowledgment of leave for more than fourteen consecutive working days will have his/her name removed from the rolls.
- Application for leave of absence should be submitted in the prescribed form to the Principal through the Tutor concerned. Bona fide applications will be positively considered subject to University regulations.
- 7. Applying for leave of absence does not imply that the leave will be granted.
- 8. Application for condonation of shortage of attendance will be considered only if the absence is on medical ground and necessary Medical Certificate is attached.
- 9. In the case of medical leave, Medical Certificate should be submitted along with the application for leave or soon after the medical treatment is over.
- 10. Students who could not attend classes on account of

their participation in sports and games, university arts festivals, seminars, workshops and such other extra curricular activities within or outside the campus may submit an application for leave to the Principal, through proper channel. Bona fide applications will be positively considered subject to University regulations.

11. No student is expected to approach the Principal or the Principal's office in person for enquiry on attendance. In case of any doubts or grievances, they may approach the tutor concerned.

F. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES BANNED

Political activities are strictly prohibited on the college campus. As per the order of the Honourable High Court of Kerala on writ appeal No.535/2003 and judgment on review petition dated 20 February 2004, all strikes, demonstrations, agitations, dharnas, gheraoes and the like are banned on the college campus. Students who violate the above rules are liable to be dismissed from the college. Therefore, students shall keep away from all sorts of agitations like strike, disturbing classes, taking out processions, uttering slogans etc. on the college premises. They shall not bring flags, placards, leaflets, pamphlets, notice boards, banners, posters or any publicity material of any political parties or student organizations to the campus.

G. RAGGING: A SERIOUS CRIMINAL OFFENSE

Ragging is prohibited by law. It is a non-bailable criminal offence and punishable with rigorous imprisonment up to seven years. Students shall not indulge in any of the following activities, which are treated as ragging:

- 1. Any act that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of a student.
- 2. Exploiting the service of a junior student by a senior student or a group of senior students.
- Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a junior student including fund-raising for organizations.
- 4. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: annoying, playing practical jokes, sexual abuse, homosexual assaults ,stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts or gestures.
- 5. Any act of abuse by spoken words, emails, SMS, or any other means.
- 6. Any word or act that causes hurt to the dignity of the individual.
- 7. Entering without permission in to any class other than the one assigned to a student.
- 8. Forcing a student to boycott class without his/her consent to participate in strike, demonstration, dharna etc.
 - The complaints or information with regard to ragging could be oral.

Reporting Cases of Ragging

The complaints or information in regard to ragging could be oral or written and even from third parties. The burden/ responsibility of proving his/her innocence rests with the accused. Complaints can be lodged with the Principal, Staff Counsellors or any of the members of the Ragging Prevention Committee. All complaints / information received shall be kept strictly confidential.

In the event of a student being booked in a criminal offence and being suspended from the college, he / she will be reinstated only after his/her obtaining clearance certificate from the concerned police officer.

Excerpts from the UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in Higher Educational Institutions - 2009

Ragging in all its forms is prohibited in the College campus, including the departments, all its premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen, restrooms, etc), within the campus or outside it and all means of transportation whether public or private. The provisions of the Act of the Central Government or the State Governments if enacted will consider ragging as a cognizable offence under the law on a par with rape and other atrocities against women and ill-treatment of persons belonging to the SC/ST.

H. PARKING OF STUDENTS VEHICLES

Entry of student vehicles into the campus is strictly prohibited by the Honble High Court. Students can park their vehicles only on the parking area designated. Vehicles parked in the non-parking area will be reported to the police.

I. MEETINGS AND CELEBRATIONS

Students should obtain written permission from the Head of the Department for organizing meetings, parties or celebrations. No student is permitted to remain on the campus

after 5.30 pm unless he/she should have special permission from HoD/Principal.

J. OTHER RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. Smoking and consumption of alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited within the campus. Students shall not use or bring tobacco or its products, intoxicating drinks or narcotic substances to the college.
- 2. Students shall not go on tour, picnic or excursion without the written permission of the Principal.
- 3. Prior written permission of the Principal is necessary for organizing processions, meetings, entertainment programmes, functions in the college; for collecting funds from the students/staff; and for distributing notice or putting up any notice on the noticeboard.
- 4. Students shall not cause any loss or damage to the college property. Intentional causing of loss or damage will be considered a serious misconduct. The offenders will be proceeded against for the same and will be liable for recovery of the loss. Unintentional causing of loss or damage will result in the recovery of loss or damages from the offenders.

Students shall not write or make any marks on the walls or any part of the college property. If found guilty they are liable to be punished and the expenses for the repair work will be recovered from the offenders.

- 5. Cinematic dances and fashion shows are not permitted on the campus.
- Congregating at the entrance of the college gate and sitting on the portico and the steps of the staircase are to be avoided.
- Students are free to follow and practice, any religion of their choice but external worship other than catholic is not allowed in the college.
- 8. A student who has any complaint against any other student, teaching staff or non teaching staff shall represent the same either in writing or orally to the Tutor, HoD, Discipline Committee or to the Principal directly. Such representations can be made by the Parents/Guardian of the students also. A complaint box is installed near the college office in this regard

K. MISCONDUCT AND DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

- Students are bound to obey the directions, issued from time to time, by the Principal, Teachers and the authorities. Disobedience to such directions would amount to serious misconduct.
- Any student, who is found to have conducted himself/ herself in any indecent or disorderly manner inside or outside the classroom in the college premises is liable to be proceeded against for the said misconduct.
- 3. A teacher may send a student out of the class if the student misbehaves in the class. If any student is sent out of the class, the teacher and the student shall report them to the Principal.
- 4. The Principal shall have the power to inflict the following

punishments upon the offenders: fine, cancellation of attendance, withholding the term certificate, forfeiting education concession and scholarship, suspension, compulsory issue of T.C. without the application from the student or guardian, and expulsion.

 Any student/students is/are found engaged in defaming the college, staff members or college authorities by posting indecent comments in social media, college management will take stringent actions in the light of cyber law.

ADMISSION RULES AND PROCEDURES

- Admission to various UG programmes is being done online by the college strictly as per the rules and regulations stipulated by the University of Calicut and the Government of Kerala.
- Rank list will be prepared on the basis of merit and will be published in the college website and notice board. Schedule of the interview will also be published in the college website.
- 3. At the time of interview the applicant should produce the intimation card and the following certificates in original:
 - Transfer Certificate
 - Conduct Certificate
 - Mark List
 - Pass Certificate
 - Community certificate, Nativity certificate and SSLC in case of SC, ST, OEC, OBC candidates.
 - Income certificate in the case of students belonging to forward communities, if applying for fee concession.

- Seven copies of recent passport size photograph of the applicant.
- 4. If an applicant fails to report for interview at the time mentioned, ipso facto, he or she forfeits the chance for admission.
- 5. If admission is given at the time of the interview, the applicant may get himself or herself enrolled forthwith on payment of the first installment of class fees.
- 6. It is advisable that the class fees for the whole year be paid in lump sum at the time of admission itself.
- 7. All admissions will be provisional and subject to verification and approval by the University of Calicut.
- 8. On securing admission, the pass certificate of the qualifying examination and other certificates are to be surrendered to the college. The students are, therefore, advised to keep with them sufficient number of attested true copies of the certificates.
- All those who wish to apply for fee concession, scholarship or stipend of any kind should keep with them the following: attested true copies of - the mark list, the certificate providing date of birth, and Community Certificate.
- 10. The caution deposit will be refunded to the student only after completion of the course or at the time of his or her leaving the college with transfer certificate.
- 11. Students belonging to scheduled caste, scheduled tribes, other eligible communities and other backward communities should produce the necessary income certificate or community certificate in the prescribed form to get the benefit of the fee concession. Such students shall, however, pay the caution deposit.
- 12. All columns in Income Certificate and Community Certificate and application form for fee concession shall

- neatly, legibly and correctly be filled in with full particulars without leaving any column blank. Defective application will be rejected.
- 13. The duly filled in application for fee concession shall be returned to the office within 7 days with all the required certificates.

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS:

The college ensures the following financial aids for the deserving students.

I E-Grantz is web-based solution for the timely disbursement of educational grants/concessions to all eligible SC/ST/OBC/other eligible students including fishermen, instituted by the Government of Kerala. UG/PG/PhD students who are eligible for receiving E -grants Scholarship/fisherman Scholarships will be eligible for all state/central/university scholarships at the same time. The financial assistance reaches the student's bank account through Direct Beneficiary Transfer (DBT).

II. Post-matric scholarship for minorities is provided by the Ministry of Minority Affairs (MOMA) for the upliftment of students belonging to minority communities. According to the Government of India, Muslims, Sikhs, Christians, Buddhists, Zoroastrians (Parsis) and Jains are notified as minority communities. Under this post-matric scholarship for minorities, students studying in class 11 to Ph.D.

- are offered up to INR 10,000 annually to pursue higher education.
- III. Central Sector Scholarship Scheme for College and University Students is a centrally-funded merit-cummeans scholarship initiated by the Department of Higher Education of MHRD. Started with the objective to financially assist students of economically underprivileged families, Central Sector Scholarship scheme is disbursed among a total of 82,000 graduate/postgraduate students every year. This scholarship is given in equal proportion to boys and girls, i.e., 41,000 of the total number of scholarships are reserved for boys and the other 41,000 are for girl candidates. The selected students receive an annual scholarship amount of up to INR 20,000 so that they could meet their day-to-day expenses while pursuing higher studies.
- IV **Kerala State Forward Caste Welfare Scholarship** is a Government of Kerala undertaking incorporated with the Companies Act, 1956 as a private Limited Company, with an objective to promote the comprehensive development and welfare of the economically backward sections among the forward communities of Kerala.
- V Alphonsa Meritorious Freeship (AMF) Alphonsa Meritorious Freeship rewards meritorious students with financial assistance, which helps them realize their educational dreams of achieving a fulfilling career. The merit-based scholarships evaluate a studentts merit on the basis of their academic records or their performance in scholarship tests.
- VI Alphonsa Student Support Scholarship (ASSS) Alphonsa

Student Support Scholarship aims to provide support to needy students from financially weaker sections to pursue higher education. These scholarships for poor students are at the forefront of our fight against poverty and inequality. This scholarship will definitely support bright students coming from economically weaker sections of the society.

- VII Alphonsa Talented Students Award (ATSA) Alphonsa Talented Students Award (ATSA) is an award for the talented students at ACT. There are students who secured good positions in the Cultural and Sports events. ATSA was formed to support those talented students. A scholarship holder under this scheme will not hold any other scholarship / stipend / financial aid from the institution. The payment of the Scholarship (Rupees 500/-) will be sent to the selected scholars on the basis of their achievements in cultural/ sports events at the National/ University/ State/ District/ Zonal levels. The talented students' selection will be jointly made by the Principal/ Head of the Institute, the Vice- Principal and the Union Advisor.
- VIII Alphonsa Outstanding Award For Out-Going Students (Aoafos) Alphonsa Outstanding Award for Out- Going Students rewards meritorious students with financial assistance. This award is offered to the out-going students who secured top marks University Exams from each department. The cash award (Rupees 1000/-) will be proportionately distributed among the different Departments. This, merit -based award evaluates a student's merit on the basis of their total academic score in the University Exams.

WORKING DAYS AND CLASS HOURS

The College works under the full day system. The session begins at 9.15 a.m. and concludes at 3.15 p.m. Before the commencement of classes, there will be a bell when the students should go into their respective classes and occupy their seats. Every day the classes shall begin with a prayer. When the bell for the prayer is heard all students shall stand up and those who move about in the campus shall stand still in their place in prayerful attitude. After the prayer there will be a signal bell for work to begin.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance shall be taken for hours of study rather than days of study, to fulfill the stipulations that the CE marks for attendance shall be calculated separately for each course in a Programme.

Aggregate attendance will be used for determining the eligibility to write the End Semester Examination - minimum 75% attendance – and not for calculating the CE marks for attendance.

Once the final aggregate attendance statement for the Semester is published, no change will be entertained.

A student who gets less than 75% aggregate attendance is not eligible to write the End Semester Examination. He/She will have to get readmission and repeat the semester with the next batch or granted admission, if eligible for it. Marks/grades for attendance for calculating CE will be given as per the University/College regulations.

Students who intend to avail any kind of leave, other than emergency leave, shall inform and get prior permission

of the Principal for the same. This applies to those who wish to get the benefit of attendance for participating in inter-collegiate competitions/and for internal co/extra-curricular activities

"Condonation of attendance to a maximum of 10 days in a Semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of a Degree Programme may be granted by the University. Benefits of attendance may be granted to students who attend to University Union activities, meetings of university bodies and participation in extracurricular activities by treating as present for the days of their absence for the above purpose on production of participation/ attendance certificate in such activities issued by the University Authorities/Principals, subject to a maximum of 10 days in a Semester. Those who secure a minimum of 75 % attendance in the aggregate for all the Courses of a Semester taken together alone will be allowed to register for the End Semester Examination of the Semester"

APPLICATION FOR LEAVE

A student requiring leave for only an hour or a portion of an hour must apply for it to the concerned teacher before the period begins.

A student requiring leave for a whole day must apply for it in writing to the Principal through the tutor concerned /HoD.

Application for leave of absence should reach the tutor concerned at least by 9.15 a.m. of the day for which leave is applied.

OPEN HOUSES, INTERNAL EXAMINATIONS & PROGRESS REPORTS

Students are not allowed to abstain themselves from assignment works, seminars, composition, test papers, internal

and end semester examinations.

Open Houses will be arranged twice during an academic year. The dates for the Open Houses will be informed through the ward by the respective tutor.

Parents/Guardians must attend both the Open Houses with the ward and meet the respective Head of the department and collect the Progress Report of the student from the tutor.

Parents/Guardians of those students who show poor progress should take care to meet the respective teachers as frequently as possible

EXCURSIONS, PICNICS AND STUDY TOUR

Students are not permitted to organize or conduct excursions or picnics without the knowledge and consent of the Principal.

Study tours will be organized by the respective Departments.

Only final year/final semester students will be permitted to go on excursions and tours.

Written consent in the prescribed form should be obtained from the parents/guardians by all students going on excursion.

A detailed programme of travel, stay, places of visit, names of participants etc. should be submitted to the Principal before proceeding on a tour or excursion.

No student from another class will be permitted to join a class going on excursion.

There should be at least two teachers (one male and one

female) to accompany each team.

Excursions, picnics and tours will be allowed ONLY during the Third Term of the academic year.

The duration of the excursion shall not exceed 3 days including the days of journey.

LIBRARY GUIDELINES

The College Library will remain open on all working days from 9.00 a.m to 5 p.m.

Learning resources in the Reference Section will not be lent out.

If a book is overdue beyond one month the fine will be Re. 1 per day till the date of return of the book(s).

Borrowers will be held responsible for any damage caused to books or any reference material belonging to the library. Borrowers will be held responsible for any damage caused to a book. When a book is issued to a member it is presumed that it is in good condition, unless otherwise pointed out. If a book is damaged or lost by a member, he/she will have to replace it or pay the cost of the book at the current rates with fine.

All the books must be returned to the library before the closing of each term, or at the time of sending the applications for the End Semester/ University Examinations.

Rules and regulations of the library have to be strictly followed.

MENTORING

ACT has implemented an effective mentoring system for the students. It aims at promoting better understanding

between the teacher and the students and thus to facilitate the moral, spiritual and intellectual wellbeing of the students. A class is under the personal care of a Lecturer (Mentor) who meets them in group on a regular basis. Students are encouraged to meet the mentor for proper guidance and counseling. The mentor keeps contact with parents as well. By the interaction of the parents, teachers and students, the overall growth of the students are taken care of. The mentor is a guide, friend, and philosopher for the students on the campus.

HINTS FOR EFFECTIVE STUDY

Association with students who are earnest in their studies is a great help to study. No amount of private study or tuition can substitute active listening in class. Avoid private tuition, which reduces self-confidence and initiative. All assignments should be done neatly up to date. Note down the work assigned for the next day. Never omit a lesson or any assignment given. Revise the work done in class daily. Set aside a fixed time for daily study at home. Remember that asking questions is the key to learning. Never hesitate to ask questions about the subject matter in and out of class. When studying, ready yourself to explain the lesson to another. Pray to God, the source of your talents, for the grace to discover and develop them. Remember that 'a stitch in time saves nine'.

RECOMMENDATION TO PARENTS

The active involvement of parents in the education of their children is very much required in this modern era. This is achieved through the interaction of parents with the teachers and the college authorities. Class wise parents meetings are held in every term after the exams for analyzing the results and the general performance of the student in the College and at home. Occasional visits of parents to the College and dialogue with the authorities especially the mentor is very much encouraged. These visits and the interaction with the authorities are to enhance the overall development of the students. To encourage this and to attend to the requests of the parents, records are maintained in the college for the parents by the mentor. The college administration checks these and addresses the issues regularly.

EXAMINATIONS AND REPORTS

Besides the regular class tests there will be official terminal examinations conducted in common for the students on the dates specified in the Handbook. Attendance at examination is compulsory. Students not appearing for the examination without prior permission from the Principal will be seriously dealt with and fined.

EVALUATION AND GRADING

Mark system is followed instead of direct grading for each paper. The evaluation scheme for each course shall contain two parts

- 1) Internal assessment
- 2) External Evaluation

20% weight shall be given to the internal assessment. The remaining 80% weight shall be for the external evaluation.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

20% of the total marks in each course are for internal assessment. The internal assessment shall be based on a

predetermined transparent system involving written test/assignments/seminars/viva and attendance in respect of theory courses. Components with percentage of marks of Internal Evaluation of Theory Courses are Attendance 25%, Assignment/Seminar/Viva 25% Test paper 50%.

Internal assessment of the project will be based on its content, method of presentation, final conclusion and orientation to research aptitude.

ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

Transfer Certificates will be issued only after payment of all dues to the College.

A student, past or present, applying for certificates for Transfer, Conduct, etc. shall do so in writing in the prescribed form to the Principal stating the Year of Study, Admission Number, Class last attended and Home address.

The application for caution deposit shall be accompanied by the original receipt of the payment of the caution deposit.

Ordinarily a notice of 24 hours is necessary for the issue of a certificate.

No certificate will be sent by post.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The College provides several opportunities to the students of this College to discover and develop their creative and artistic talents along with their academic pursuit. Various activities are organized with this aim in view, under the guidance of competent teachers in each field. Talented students are given all possible opportunities to compete in the various inter-collegiate competitions.

COLLEGE UNION AND SUBJECT ASSOCIATIONS

Every year the students elect under the Parliamentary system a College Union Chairman, Vice-Chairman, General Secretary, Arts Club Secretary, Student Editor, Class Representatives, and Secretaries to the various Subject Associations. Various co-curricular activities of the College are organized and conducted by the College Union under the guidanceof the concerned teachers.

Student representatives elected as Subject Association Secretaries will organize lectures, seminars, debates etc, related to their main subject of study under the guidance of the teachers of their respective Departments. Competitions will be held and proficiency prizes awarded on the College Day.

COLLEGE CANTEEN

Run on contract basis, the canteen serves noon meals and other refreshments on all working days.
